YEAR IN REVIEW: 2025 WAS A TABLE-SETTER

If the Brent Spence Bridge Corridor (BSBC) Project were a banquet, then 2025 was the year the table was set. An ODOT building in Cincinnati was demolished to make way for the widening of I-75. Mussels in the Ohio River were moved upstream to make way for the companion bridge. Utilities, meanwhile, both overhead and underground, were moved to accommodate new roadways. With major construction scheduled to begin next year, 2026 promises to be busy thanks to the preparations made in 2025.

THROWBACK: NEW YEAR'S EVE PROGRESS

As the 1962 holiday season came to a close, work on the original Brent Spence Bridge continued, captured in this black-and-white photo taken on New Year's Eve. This image, taken on the Kentucky side of the river, looks west toward the junction of the new bridge with Pier No. 4.

The year was full of milestone moments. Just a day earlier, on December 30, 1962, the Green Bay Packers defeated the New York Giants to win the 1962 NFL Championship Game at the Polo Grounds.

It was a banner year for culture and history as well. Spider-Man made his debut, Johnny Carson took over The Tonight Show, and The Beatles released their first single, "Love Me Do," a song about connection written by John Lennon and Paul McCartney. That same year, John Glenn became the first American to orbit Earth.

Construction would continue all year, with a November 1963 opening.



PROJECT TEAM MEMBERS HIGHLIGHT WORKFORCE OPPORTUNITIES

The BSBC Project is brimming with workforce opportunities, according to two of its leaders.

"This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity," said Tommy Arnold, project manager for the Ohio Department of Transportation, at a recent event for community members and other stakeholders. "Six million labor hours will be required to build this project. That's an incredible amount of work."

Hosted by the Urban League, the event also featured Marvin Jackson, business and workforce engagement program manager for Walsh Kokosing, which is the prime contractor on the project.

In addition to describing the project's scope and timeline, Arnold and Jackson highlighted:

- Key trades needed on the project;
- Anticipated wages; and
- Related projects tied to the corridor, north and south of the new companion bridge.

The event was conducted at the Urban League of Greater Southwestern Ohio's Holloman Center for Social Justice.


