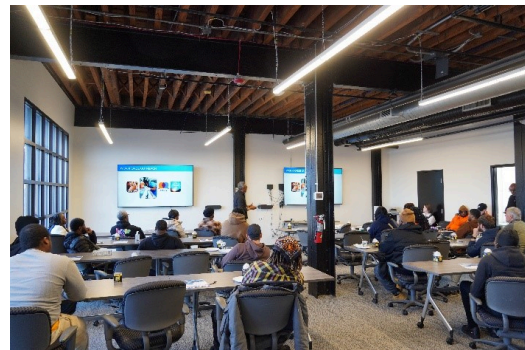

MAKING WAY FOR MAJOR CONSTRUCTION



Steel girders staged on Winchell Avenue will be used to build a retaining wall.

Preparations are under way in the Interstate 75 corridor south of Ezzard Charles Drive in Cincinnati to make way for major construction later this year on the Brent Spence Bridge Corridor Project.

Workers are installing a new water main in [Gest Street](#) between Freeman and Seventh avenues. Crews on Winchell Avenue near West Court Street, meanwhile, are clearing trees and other vegetation, as well as demolishing a pedestrian bridge.

As one of the first signs of construction, the Linn Street Bridge over I-75 will be closed so it can be demolished and replaced. More information, detour maps and videos are available on the [project website](#).

“Activity is definitely ramping up,” said Tommy Arnold, project manager for the Ohio Department of Transportation. “We’re really excited to see major construction soon.”

In particular, Arnold said he’s eager to see work begin later this year in the Ohio River to build the new companion bridge immediately west of the Brent Spence Bridge.

Stretching from the Western Hills Viaduct in Ohio to Dixie Highway in Kentucky, the project will be built without tolls and transform an eight-mile portion of the I-71/75 interstate corridor, including a companion bridge immediately to the west of the existing bridge.
